A Christmas Story

The following contains excerpts from a letter sent from a GCHRC client. She begins the letter with what the agency's help meant for her and her children:

Purchasing my new house means providing stability, peace, and a sense of belonging for me and my three children. I am the first of my parent's children to become a homeowner – an achievement that I am extremely proud of. I am able to give my children the best Christmas gift this year – a home.

Before purchasing a home I faced very expensive rent payments, and difficulties budgeting and saving. I knew I wanted to purchase a home but with rent at \$950 I knew I would never be able to save enough. I drove from Pelham Road to Fountain Inn every day for two years and one day I happened to look to my left and saw this cute home with green shutters on Fairview Street. I remember thinking how convenient it must be for that family to live so close to the school. A few weeks went by and suddenly a sign appeared in the yard. I saw my children running in the yard and me sitting on the porch. I called Joy Realty on a whim

and scheduled a walk-through. I took my kids and my mother with me to view the home and fell in love with it even more. The kids ran through the house saving which room was theirs and where their beds would go and a tear rolled down my cheek. I knew I had no money and no way of owning a home. I felt defeated. Every day I looked online to look at the house and soon realized it was a GCRA renovated home. Soon after I met with Sharon Smathers at GCHRC and began the application process, and I quickly learned that this would be no easy task.

Sharon recommended I meet with Chris Payne - a counselor at GCHRC. Chris was direct, realistic and to the point. I left knowing exactly what I needed to do. He outlined a strict budget, credit counseling and savings plan. I told Chris I had no way of saving that kind of money on my own, and that was when he introduced me to Deborah Ciufo. Ms. Deborah was very optimistic, energetic and encouraging. She explained the IDA Program, which for savings towards a down payment guarantees a match of 3:1. I thought it was too good to be true. I said 'so you mean to tell me if I save

\$1000, IDA would match me \$3000?'. I don't know if it was Deborah's enthusiasm or the thought that I actually might be able to do this, but I started having hope.

My current lease was quickly expiring and my fears of having to spend money to move into another expensive apartment loomed over me every day. I called Chris and asked him if there was anything I could do – he suggested that I ask if I could lease the home I wanted to purchase. I had a lot of doubts, but if it wasn't for his creative thinking, I wouldn't be in my home today. I moved in under a lease with an option to purchase.

Almost two years later, I was able to obtain financing and will be a homeowner just before this Christmas! I would like to thank Sharon Stephen and Martin Livingston with GCRA, Chris Payne and Deborah Ciufo with Greenville County Human Relations, Greg Burgess with Community Works Carolina, and United Way for helping give individuals such as myself the opportunity to live the American Dream.
