i. **CZ-2024-035,** Property located at 2101, 2145 and 2155 Old Spartanburg Road and Hudson Road, Greer (Council District 22), requesting rezoning from PD to PD Major Change.

b. Fountain Inn Fire Service Area / General Obligation Bond

Action:

Chairman Pro Tem Kirven moved for adoption at third reading an ordinance to provide for the issuance and sale of not exceeding three million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$3,800,000) Greenville County General Obligation Bonds (Fountain Inn Fire Service Area Project), Series 2024C; to prescribe the purposes for which the proceeds shall be expended; to provide for the payment thereof; and other matters related thereto.

c. Fuyao Glass America Inc. (formerly Project Dragon Fire) / Fee in Lieu of Tax Agreement

Chairman Pro Tem Kirven moved for adoption at third reading an ordinance authorizing the execution and delivery of a second amendment to an existing fee in lieu of tax agreement between Greenville County, South Carolina and Fuyao Glass America Inc., formerly known as Project Dragon Fire; to provide for, under certain circumstances, certain additional special source revenue credits in connection with additional investment in certain manufacturing and related facilities in the County; and other matters related thereto.

d. Special Tax Districts – Millage or Fee Increase for Maintenance of Lighting

Action:

Chairman Pro Tem Kirven moved for adoption at third reading an ordinance to provide for the millage or fee rate to be levied by certain Special Tax Districts established for lighting purposes; including the Brutontown, Monaghan, River Oak, Woodside Mills, Broadmoor, and Washington Heights Special Tax Districts.

Item (11) <u>Ordinances – Second Reading</u>

a. Zoning Ordinances

i. CZ-2024-036, Property located at 123 Mason St., Ross St., & 4, 6, & 8 Jones St., Greenville, (Council District 23), requesting rezoning from NC & R-7.5 to FRD. The Planning Commission and Committee recommended approval with a condition.

vi. CZ-2024-045, Property located at 202 Brown Rd., Sagittarius Way, and Interstate-185, Piedmont and Greenville, (Council District 25), requesting rezoning from R-MA to I-1. The Planning Commission and the Committee recommended approval.

Action: On behalf of the Committee, Councilor Fant moved approval of the ordinance at second reading.

vii. CZ-2024-046, Property located at 1726 A Hwy. 418, Pelzer (Council District 26), requesting rezoning from R-R3 to C-1. The Planning Commission and the Committee recommended approval.

b. Foothills Fire District / Millage Increase

c. Vermeer Corporation (formerly Project Gold) / Fee in Lieu of Tax Agreement

Action: Chairman Pro Tem Kirven moved for approval at second reading an ordinance authorizing the execution and delivery of an amended and restated fee in lieu of tax and special source credit agreement by and between Greenville County, South Carolina and a company or companies known to the County at this time as Project Gold with respect to certain economic development property in the County, whereby such property would be subject to certain payments in lieu of taxes, including the provision of certain special source credits; and other matters related thereto.

Item (12) Ordinances – First Reading

a. Slater-Marietta Fire District / General Obligation Bonds

Chairman Pro Tem Kirven presented for first reading an ordinance finding that the Slater-Marietta Fire District may issue not exceeding \$1,275,000 of general obligation bonds; to authorize the Board of Fire Control of the Slater-Marietta Fire District, South Carolina, to issue such bonds and to provide for the publication of notice of the said finding and authorization.

Chairman Tripp stated the item would remain on the floor.

b. Lake Cunningham Fire District / General Obligation Bonds

Chairman Pro Tem Kirven presented for first reading an ordinance finding that the Lake Cunningham Fire District may issue not exceeding \$9,000,000 of general obligation bonds; to authorize the Board of Fire Control of the Lake Cunningham Fire District, South Carolina, to issue such bonds and to provide for the publication of notice of the said finding and authorization.

Chairman Tripp stated the item would remain on the floor.

c. Metropolitan Sewer Subdistrict / Boundary Enlargement

Councilor Mitchell presented for first reading an ordinance authorizing the enlargement of the territory of the Metropolitan Sewer Subdistrict and other matters relating thereto.

Item (15) Requests and Motions by Council Members

a. Motion to Reconsider at Third Reading – Zoning Docket CZ-2024-021

CZ-2024-021, Property located at 2222 & 2224 E. Lee Road, Taylors, requesting rezoning from R-20 to R-10. The Planning Commission recommended approval and the Committee recommended denial.

Councilor Shaw stated during the August 20, 2024, County Council meeting, the above-referenced item was denied by Council at third reading. The item had been held since earlier in the year, and he had inadvertently failed to request it be held again. Mr. Shaw stated he felt strongly that the developer and the community were close to reaching an agreement regarding the request. If the denial were to stand, it would cause a hardship for the applicant. Mr. Shaw requested his colleagues reconsider the item; if they did so, he would again request it be held.
