

# THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA.

## EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

By the Secretary of State.

WHEREAS, J. Thomas Arnold, Jos. A. McCullough, Lewis W. Parker, Thos. F. Parker, J.M. Geer, J.E. Sistine, W.J. Thackston and L. Rothchild of Greenville, S.C. and W.S. Lee of Charlotte, N.C.

did on the eighteenth day of July, 1910 file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

First: The names and residences of the said petitioners to be as above given.

Second: The name of the proposed corporation be that of HOME, LIGHT & POWER COMPANY

Third: The principal place of business of the corporation will be Greenville, S.C.

Fourth: The general purpose of the corporation, and the nature of business it proposes to do. To buy, sell, manufacture, generate, store, lease or use gas or electricity for power or heat or other purposes and to distribute the same over and under any of the Streets, avenues, highways or public places within or near the City of Greenville, in the State of South Carolina, with the consent of the local authorities of such city; and to make contracts for the sale of electricity electric lights or electric power with said City; to acquire, buy, purchase or otherwise, the shares, bonds or other securities of any other gas or electric power, light or heat company or any company therein buying, selling and otherwise trafficking in any of the same. To buy, sell, lease or otherwise acquire or dispose of lands, plants, business, good-will, patents, patent rights and all privileges and rights in connection with the operation and maintenance of an electric lighting plant or system. To make, manufacture or repair, buy, sell, lease or deal in any and all machinery, apparatus or appliances, and any and all fixtures chandeliers, lamps, globes, meters, pipes, lamp fixtures, gas fixtures, engines, electrical devices or other supplies and all other articles and conveniences now used or which may hereafter be used, required or deemed advisable for or in connection with the exercise of any of the rights, powers privileges and authorities for the carrying on of the business set forth in this certificate and all articles and conveniences which may be calculated, directly or indirectly, to promote the consumption and utilization of electricity and gas, or any and all of the forces, fluids, currents or powers herein mentioned. To make, enter into, perform and carry out contracts of every kind, for any lawful purpose, with any person, firm, association, municipality or corporation. To acquire, hold, own, sell, transfer and assign the whole or any part of the capital stock or any other securities of any other corporation similarly engaged. To issue bonds, debentures of obligations on the company from time to time for any of the objects or purposes of the Company, and to secure the same by mortgage, pledge, deed of trust or otherwise. To build, construct, operate and maintain lines of poles, wires and other necessary apparatus and appliances for the purpose of transmitting electricity to be used for power, heating, lighting or other purposes. To lay plants or construct gas plants, gas mains and all other fixtures, apparatus and appliances in connection with the general distribution and selling of gas. To own, acquire, buy, lease, let, sell and improve real estate in such quantities as may be expedient. FIFTH: The amount of the Capital stock to be ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS, and the number of shares into which the same is to be divided to be One hundred

of the par value of One hundred dollars each.

Sixth: The capital stock to be payable as set forth in the Declaration and Petition.

AND WHEREAS, on 18th day of July A. D. 1910 the date above named, petitioners were commissioned by me a Board of Corporators:

That, furthermore, they have complied with all the requirements of the Code of Laws of the State of South Carolina, of 1902, and all Acts of parts or Acts amendatory thereto;

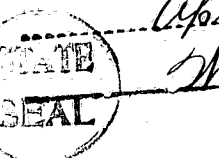
