## EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, H. L. Todd and W. F. Bryson

did on the 28th, day of June, 1912, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

That, furthermore, they have complied with all the requirements of the Code of Laws of the State of South Carolina, of 1902, and all Acts of parts or Acts amendatory thereto;
