KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, Columbus Dandy, of the County of Greenville

in the State aforesaid

in consideration of the sum of Five and no/100 Dollars to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by

Frank Dandy, of the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said

Frank Dandy, all my right, title and interest, the same being one undivided one seventh, in and to all that certain piece, parcel and tract of land, situate, lying and being in Gantt Township in said State and County, on the waters of Saluda River, having the following metes and bounds: Beginning at a persimmon tree 3X and running; thence S. 11 W. 16.30 to a stone 3X; thence N. 75-1/2 E. 5.12 to a stone 3X; thence N. 71-1/2 E. 20.16 to a stone 3X; thence N. 6-1/2 E. 11.70 to a corner in a road near a fork; thence along and with said road 18.00 to a stone 3X; thence S. 14 W. 11.40 to the beginning, adjoining lands of John Satterfield, Mackey and others, containing 50-1/4 acres, more or less, being the same land which was conveyed to Thos. Dandy by Judge Yancy Feb. 20, 1899 deed recorded in the R.M.C. office for Greenville County in Book F.F.F at page 456. My said interest being my share as one of the heirs at law of said Thomas Dandy.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned unto the said Frank Dandy, and his heirs and assigns forever.

AND I do hereby bind myself and my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Frank Dandy, and his

heirs and assigns, against me and my heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
