liabilities of such merged trust companies, whether as debtor, depositary, registrar, transfer agent, executor, administrator, trustee, or otherwise;

That such agreement for merger was approved by the Bank Commissioner on the 15th day of July, 1911, and thereupon became effective.

It further appears of record in this office by the return made in accordance with the provisions of law relating thereto that the said agreement for merger was approved by the several boards of directors of the said Old Colony Trust Company, Massachusetts Trust Company, Mercantile Trust Company and City Trust Company at meeting duly called for the purpose, at each of which meetings a quorum was present; that the said agreement for merger was signed in behalf of the said Old Colony Trust Company, Massachusetts Trust Company, Mercantile Trust Company and City Trust Company by their officers duly authorized at such meetings;

That the said agreement for merger was approved by the stockholders of said Old Colony Trust Company, Massachusetts Trust Company, Mercantile Trust Company and City Trust Company at meetings duly called for the purpose; that at said meetings all of the acts hereinbefore referred to in relation to said merger by officers of the said Old Colony Trust Company, Massachusetts Trust Company, Mercantile Trust Company and City Trust Company were in all respects ratified and confirmed; that throughout each of said meetings there were present in person or duly represented by proxy a quorum for the transaction of business, and more that two-thirds in interest of the stockholders of each company, and that each of the foregoing actions was taken by unanimous vote of said stockholders present or so represented.
