. 11.00 to the beginning, as will more fully appear by reference to a plat of said tract made by D.M. Boyce, in

A.D. 1895. And being the same property and tract of land that was conveyed to W.H. Irvine by J.W. GRay, Master by deed dated February 29th, A.D. 1906, and by said W.H. Irvine to P.S. Butler, and all other persons rightfully from, under or by him freed from all liens and incumbrances.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said J.E. Lipscomb his heirs and assigns, forever.
