WHEREAS Greers Manufacturing Company was heretofore duly incorporated under the laws of this State, AND WHEREAS a meeting of the stockholders duly called by the Board of Directors of said corporation was held on May 14, 1912, of which meeting thirty days notice was given by mail to each stockholder, stating the time, place and purpose of meeting, and by publishing a copy of said notice in the Daily Piedmont, a newspaper published in the City of Greenville, County and State aforesaid, for thirty days prior to said meeting, at which meeting more than two-thirds in amount of all the stock in said corporation was represented,
