CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION,

WHEREAS, Joseph A. McCullough, W.C. Beacham and F.A. Lawton., All of Greenville, S.C. two or more of the officers or agents appointed to supervise or manage the affairs of

THE BRUNER INDUSTRIAL HOME.,

which has been duly and regularly organized, did on the 17th day of September, A.D. 1909, file with the Secretary of State a written declaration setting forth:

That at a meeting of the aforesaid organization held pursuant to the by-laws or regulations of the said organization, they were authorized and directed to apply for incorporation.

That the said organization holds, or desires to hold, property in common for a Religious, Educational, Social, Fraternal, Charitable or other eleemosynary purpose, or any two or more of said purposes, and is not organized for the purpose of profit or gain to the members, otherwise than is above stated, or for the insurance of life, health, accident or property; and three days notice in the Daily News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville, has been given that the aforesaid Declaration would be filed.

AND WHEREAS, That said Declarants and Petitioners further declare and affirmed: FIRST, Their names and residences are as above given. Second. The name of the proposed Corporation is

THE BRUNER INDUSTRIAL HOME.,

THIRD. The place at which it proposes to have its headquarters or be located is Greenville, S.C. FOURTH. The purpose of the said proposed Corporation is to furnish a home, educational, religious and training for orphans, or dependent children,

FIFTH, The names and residences of all Managers, Trustees, Directors or other officers are as follows Joseph A. McCullough, W.C. Beacham, F.A. Lawton, Allen J. Graham, L.O. Patterson, Board of Trustees, Mrs. William G. Surrine, Mrs. Arthur G. Gower, Mrs. E.W. Carpenter, Mrs. W.S. Griffin, and Mrs. J.C. Milford, Advisory Board,

SIXTH. That they desired to be incorporated in perpetuity,

NOW, THEREFORE, I R.M. McCown, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested, by Chapter XLVIII., Article II., Code of 1902, and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby declare the said organization to be a body politic and corporate, with all the rights, powers, privileges and immunities, and subject to all the limitations and liabilities, conferred by said Chapter XLVIII., Article II., Code of 1902, and Acts amendatory thereto,
