Gray Master in and for County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One thousand eight hundred Dollars, to me paid by the said J.P. Willis

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said J.P. Willis, All that certain piece or tract of land situate in Fairview Township, County and State aforesaid, on Reedy River, and known as Tract 2, on Plat of survey of lands of the Estate of J. Edward Harrison, deceased, made by F.G. Rogers, Surveyor July - - -, 1911, and recorded in office of R.M.C. for Greenville County in Plat Book A. page 524, 525 and 526, containing 121.5 acres, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds, to wit: Beginning at a sweet gum on old road at Old Jenkins Bridge, corner of tract C; thence N. 3 W. 2.00 chains to angle in road; thence N. 43-3/4 E. 10.90 chains stake on Jenkins Bridge Road; thence N. 21 E. 10.00 chains to a stone on Jenkins Bridge Road; thence S. 32 E. 65.00 chains to a stone; thence S. 42-1/4 W. 18.79 chains to Beech XIII on bank of Reedy River; thence with meanders up said river to the beginning corner.
