the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Ira A. Gresham, All that certain parcel or lot of land of which James F. Pike died, seized and possessed, situate in Austin and Butler Township, in County and State aforesaid composed of sixty-eight acres, known as the Nix land, and a tract of twenty-two acres, and another lot of about four acres, all of which was in the possession of, and occupied by the said James F. Pike, at the time of his death, said land being on branch waters of Gilders Creek, which is a branch of Enoree River.

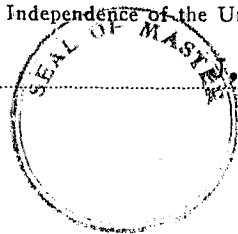
