Coleman, Robert Thompson, et al. containing one hundred and ten acres, more or less, and being the tract of land conveyed M.L. Nash, E.L. Nash, A.L. Nash, W. R. Nash, Nancy Elizabeth Nash and Mary Nash, by Mary E. Nash, by deed duly recorded in R.M.C. Office in Vol. 21, page 107.
