Hudson, all that piece, parcel or tract of land, situate, lying and being in Butler Township, County and State aforesaid, adjoining lands of H. S. Stroud, W. A. Hudson, B. W. Bramlett and others, containing ninety acres, more or less, all this land, except fifty-six acres, more or less, was sold in aid of assets by the Probate Court for County and State aforesaid, on Salesday in February, 1900; said fifty-six acres being conveyed by this deed.

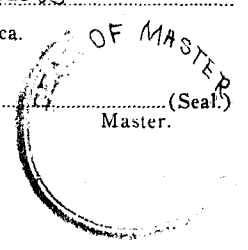
