the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Lillie V. Gray, All that certain parcel or lot of land, situate in

Ward 2 of the City of Greenville, County and State aforesaid, known as Lot no. 8 in the plat of survey of the lands of which Martha J. Howell died, seized and possessed, made by W. A.
