I, E. Inman, Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETING: WHEREAS, Onie Holliday

on or about the 7th day of October in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and Fifteen exhibited her complaint in the Court of Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against O. W. Holliday

demanding judgment in relation to the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described; and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 18th day of November 1915, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be sold by E. Inman Master in and for the County aforesaid, on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in the said E. Inman as by reference thereto on file in said Court, will appear; and the Master, after having duly advertised the said real estate for sale by public outcry on the 6th day of December in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and Fifteen did then openly and publicly, according to the custom of auction, sell and dispose of the same unto Onie Holliday

for the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars, being at that price the highest bidder therefor. NOW, THEREFORE, Know all men by these Presents, that I, E. Inman Master in and for County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars, to me paid by the said Onie Holliday,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Onie Holliday, the following described real estate:

"All that certain lot of land situated in Greenville Township, County and State aforesaid, just outside of the corporate limits of the City of Greenville, West of the Southern Railway, adjoining land of the Woodside Mills and of W. M. Norwood, and known as Lot No. 18, in plat made by W. A. Hudson, Surveyor, bearing date April 28, 1904, and being the same lot of land conveyed to O. W. Holliday by W. M. Norwood by deed on April 25, 1905 and recorded in Vol. 000, page 128, and being the same lot conveyed by O. W. Holliday to Onie Holliday by deed on June 12, 1909, and said deed being recorded in R.M.C. Office for the County of Greenville and State aforesaid, in Vol. 4, page 525

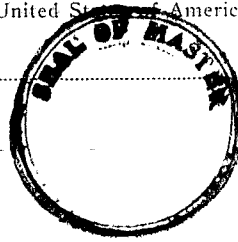
TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the premises before mentioned, unto the said Onie Holliday, her
