KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, W.D. Robertson of the County and State aforesaid in consideration of the love and affection which I have for my Son, W.T.S. Robertson, and for the further consideration of the agreement of my said Son to care for and support me and my wife M.C. Robertson, during the period of our lives and the lifetime of the ~~xxxxxxx~~ survivor of us, and in the further consideration of the sum of ~~xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx~~ Five DOLLARS, to me in hand paid ~~xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx~~ by the said W.T.S. Robertson at and before the sealing of these presents.

.....(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release, unto the said W.T.S. Robertson, the following real estate, to wit:-

All that piece, parcel and tract of land situate, lying and being in the County and State aforesaid on the headwaters of Tyger River, on both sides of the State Road, adjoining lands of E.M. Blythe and others, containing three hundred and four acres, more or less, known as the William Fuller Homestead Tract, and more particularly described by metes and bounds in a deed of conveyance thereof made and delivered to me by W.E. Earle, dated 24th, May 1875, which said deed is here referred to for a fuller description thereof. Save and except 5-1/3 acres thereof heretofore conveyed by me to A.A. Stuart.

Also one other small tract adjoining the above containing 5-1/3 acres, conveyed to me by A.A. Stuart by his deed bearing date 5th, Oct. 1878 and in said deed described by metes and bounds and here referred to for a fuller description thereof.

Also one other small tract containing 9-1/2 acres, being the same land conveyed to me by Geo. J. Southern by his deed bearing date 11, Feb. 1889 and in said deed described by metes and bounds, and here referred to for a fuller description thereof.

Both of these small tracts adjoin the 304 acre tract and are now considered as one tract with it.
