E.E. Stone

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, F.J.G. Pulsipher, of the City of New Orleans, and State of Louisiana

in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of One thousand DOLLARS, to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by E.E. Stone of Greenville, S.C.

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release, unto the said

E.E. Stone, All that piece, parcel, lot of land situate, lying and being in the City of Greenville, County and State aforesaid and on the South side of Earle Street, having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin on the South side of Earle Street between Townes and Wilton Streets, beginning at iron pin on Earle Street at corner of lot purchased by A.E. Sussex, and running thence with Sussex's line S. 5-1/2 W. Two hundred feet (200) to stake, thence N. 84-1/2 W. sixty-five and one-half (65-1/2) feet to stake, thence N. 5-1/2 E. two hundred feet to a stake on Earle Street, thence with Earle Street S. 84-1/2 E. sixty-five and one-half feet (65-1/2) to beginning corner. Reference is had to a plat of the Stone's land made by J.N. Southern Sept. 14, 1888, and recorded in office of R.M.C. Book "VV" page 542, being the same lot conveyed to me by Stone Land Co. by deed bearing date of Feb. 7, 1906 and recorded in Book "MMM" page 627, R.M.C. Greenville County.
