TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME OR BE MADE KNOWN, or whom the same may in anywise concern, I, John S. Bramlett, as Judge of the Court of Probate for Greenville County, in the said State, SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, Jason Cannon, Administrator of the Estate of Jesse W. S. Paris for one thousand and fifty (1050.00) dollars, being at that price the highest bidder for same.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said John S. Bramlett, as Judge of the Court of Probate as aforesaid, in consideration of the premises, and also in consideration of the sum of one thousand and fifty (1050.00) dollars, paid me by the said J. S. Paris the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged.

HAVE granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents, DO grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said J. S. Paris and his heirs and assigns forever, ALL that piece, parcel or tract of of land situate in Greenville County and State of South Carolina on the north side of South Tiger River, being the same tract of land willed to J. W. Cannon and H. C. Cannon by Mary Cannon, adjoining lands of Henry Roe, and others, containing twenty-eight acres, more or less.

TOGETHER with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises belonging, or in anywise appertaining, and the reversions and the remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof; and also all the estate, right, title, interest, dower, possession, property, benefit, claim and demand whatsoever, both at law and in equity, of the said Jesse W. Cannon, deceased, and of all the parties to the said suit, and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, by, from or under them, or either of them.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said premises with its hereditaments, privileges and appurtenances unto the said J. S. Paris his Heirs and Assigns forever.
