KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, James I. West of the County and State aforesaid, am held and firmly bound unto John C. Thompson in the penal sum of Four thousand and no/100 (\$4000.00) Dollars to be paid to the said John C. Thompson and his certain Attorneys, Executors, Administrators or Assigns; To which well and truly to be done I bind myself and each and every of my heirs, Executors, Administrators jointly and severally, firmly by these presents;

Sealed with my seal and dated at Greenville, S.C. the Eleventh day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirteen and in the one hundred and thirty seventh year of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America.

Whereas the above bounden James I. West has this day agreed to sell to the said John C. Thompson the following described tract of land in the State and County aforesaid about four miles from Greenville Court House on Road leading from Lownes Hill Road into the Spartanburg Road and being same tract of land conveyed to James I. West and J.A. Norris by Annice Payne and J.J. McCarter by deed bearing date Sept. 22nd, 1911 and recorded in office of R.W.C. for said County in Vol. 13, page 450, and conveyed to me (James I. West) by J.A. Norris (his one half interest) by deed bearing date February 8th, 1912 and recorded in office of R.M.C. in Vol. 17th, page 382. This tract containing Twenty Two acres more or less and adjoining lands of E.P. Hudson, J. Lee Green and others, on condition that the said John C. Thompson shall pay the sum of Two Thousand and no/100 (\$2000.00) Dollars in manner following, that is to say Three Hundred Dollars on the delivery of this agreement, Two hundred dollars July first and the balance in five equal annual payments beginning Jamuary first 1914 and on the first day of each successive January thereafter, all deferred payments to bear interest at eight per cent per annum until paid from January First 1913. Now the condition of this obligation is such, that if the said John C. Thompsin shall pay the said purchase money so as aforesaid stipulated and shall in the meantime pay all taxes on said land and the said James I. West shall on the completion of said payments make, execute and deliver a good and sufficient Deed of Conveyance in fee simple of the land above described to the said John C. Thompson, then this obligation to be void and of non effect or else to remain in full force and virtue. And it is especially agreed, by and between the parties aforesaid that time is of the essence of this contract, and that in the event of the non payment of said sum of money or any part thereof, promptly at the time herein limited, that then the said James I. West is absolutely discharged from any and all liability to make and execute any such deed and may treat the said John C. Thompson as tenant holding over after the termination or contrary to the terms of his lease, or if prefer so to do may enforce the payment of the purchase money. The said James I. West agrees that if on the first day of January 1914, the said John C. Thompson shall have complied with all the conditions of the above described obligation, that is has paid all tax, interest and purchase money then due, that he the said James I. West will make and deliver to the said John C. Thompson the above described deed and accept a Note and mortgage for the balance of said purchase money, the said Note and mortgage to bear interest at eight per cent per annum until paid.
