WHEREAS, W.C. Cleveland, C.O. Hobbs and S.A. Quinerly

did on the 29th day of September 1917 file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

First: The names and residences of the said petitioners to be as above given.

Second: The name of the proposed corporation be that of Paris Amusement Company

Third: The principal place of business of the corporation will be Paris, Greenville County, South Carolina

Fourth: The general purpose of the corporation, and the nature of business it proposes to do.

to own, conduct and operate one or more places of public amusement with motion pictures, vaudeville attractions, and other like attractions, and to buy, sell, lease or rent personal property and real property in connection with said business.

T.C. Gower, W.C. Cleveland and C.O. Hobbs:

That subsequently there was elected as President, T.C. Gower; as Vice President, - - as Secretary, W.C. Cleveland; as Treasurer; W.C. Cleveland.

Fifth: The amount of the capital stock to be

Ten thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars,

and the number of shares into which the same is to be divided to be one hundred (100,00)

Sixth: The capital stock to be payable as set forth in the Declaration and Petition. one hundred (\$100.00) dollars each.

AND WHEREAS, on the 29th day of September A. D. 1917 the date above named, petitioners were commissioned by me a Board of Corporators;

AND WHEREAS, the said Board of Corporators, on the 15th day of October 1917 did file with the Secretary of State their return in writing, over their signatures, certifying, among other things, that pursuant to publish notice as required in the commission of the said Corporators, the books of subscription to the capital stock of the said Company were duly opened on the 17th day of October 1917, and the aforesaid Company duly organized by the election of a Board of Directors, and other necessary officers. That, furthermore, they have complied with all the requirements of the Code of Laws of the State of South Carolina of 1912, and all Acts or parts of Acts amendatory thereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. Banks Dove Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purpose indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
