CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

WHEREAS.

J. E. Irvine, Ellison A. Smyth and George W. Brumson, Jr. all of Greenville, S.C.

two or more of the officers or agents appointed to supervise or manage the affairs of *Sans Souci Country Club, a social club*

which has been duly and regularly organized, did on the *eleventh* day of *March*

A. D. *1914* file with the Secretary of State a written declaration setting forth:

That at a meeting of the aforesaid organization held pursuant to the by-laws or regulations of the said organization, they were authorized and directed to apply for incorporation.

That the said organization holds, or desires to hold, property in common for a Religious, Educational, Social, Fraternal, Charitable or other eleemosynary purpose or any two or more of said purposes, and is not organized for the purpose of profit or gain to the members, otherwise than is above stated, or for the insurance of life, health, accident or property; and that three days' notice in the *Greenville Daily News* a newspaper published in the county of *Greenville*

AND WHEREAS, That said Declarants and Petitioners further declared and affirmed:

FIRST. Their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND. The name of the proposed Corporation is *Sans Souci Country Club*

THIRD. The place at which it proposes to have its headquarters or to be located is *Near Greenville, in Greenville County*

FOURTH. The purpose of the said Corporation is *To conduct a club for social and athletic purposes.*

FIFTH. The names and residences of all Managers, Trustees, Directors or other officers are as follows:
J. E. Irvine, Greenville, S.C. President
W. E. Beattie, " " Vice President
Ellison A. Smyth, " " Secretary and Treasurer
George W. Brumson, Jr. " " Secretary and Treasurer

SIXTH. That they desired to be incorporated *in perpetuity.*

Now, Therefore, I, *R. M. McCowan* Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested, by Chapter XLVIII, Article II, Code of 1902, and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby declare the said organization to be a body politic and corporate, with all rights, powers, privileges and immunities, and subject to all limitations and liabilities, conferred by said Chapter XLVIII, Article II, Code of 1902, and as Acts amendatory thereto.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State, at Columbia, this *eleventh* day of *March* in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and *fourteen* and in the one hundred and *thirty eight* year of the Independence of the United States of America.
