WHEREAS, Lee C. Harris

on or about the 3rd day of July in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and nineteen exhibited his complaint in the Court of Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against Lee Jennings, Harris, Victoria Virginia Harris and John Bearden Harris,

demanding relief as to the real estate described in the complaint: and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 12th day of August 1919, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. Duman Master in and for the County aforesaid, to Flora F. Jennings,

for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto of file in said Court, will appear; (See Judgment Roll No.         ) NOW, Therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, that I, E. Duman Master, in and for the County of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree, and upon receipt of \$500.00 HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release unto the said Flora F. Jennings

all the right, title and interest of the Plaintiff, Lee C. Harris, and of the minor Defendants, Lee Jennings Harris, Victoria Virginia Harris and John Bearden Harris, heron, in and to the following described real estate:

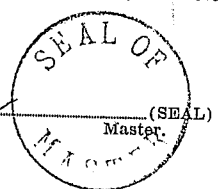
All that certain tract of land, situated, lying and being in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid on the West Side of Middle fork of Saluda River, it being a portion of the tract of land known as McJunkys tract and conveyed to John W. Goodwin by David Lythe Executor of the Will of Samuel McJunkys, deceased. This said deed being dated the 28th day of March 1861, and recorded in the Office of the M. C. for Greenville County Book 9, page 66, and being the same tract of land conveyed to Victoria E. Jennings, by her father John W. Goodwin, by deed dated October 2nd 1883, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in deed Book C.O. page 753.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining; and all the estate, right, title, claim and interest whatsoever, of the parties to the cause aforesaid, and of each of them in and to the same; and of all other persons rightfully claiming from, under, or any of them.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the premises before mentioned, unto the said Flora F. Jennings her, heirs and assigns forever.
