Conyers and T.C. Gower.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned unto the said

W.P. Conyers and T.C. Gower, their heirs and assigns, forever.

AND I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said W.P. Conyers and T.C. Gower, their

heirs and assigns, against me and my heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
