Norwood, having also the right to appoint her successor in the event of her death by her last Will and Testament; and in the event this trust shor uld at any time be administered by a trust company, such trust company to have the right to charge and to be paid from the income of such property a reasonable compensation for its services as a part of the expenses of administering this trust.

And I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Fannie C. Norwood, as Trustee, her heirs and assigns against me and my heirs, executors and administrators and all other persons lawfully claiming, or to claim the same or any part thereof.
