DEED TO W. F. Lynn

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I Fannie G. Gulisann, of Greenville County

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Twenty Seven hundred and fifty (\$2750.00) DOLLARS, to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by W. F. Lynn

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said

W. F. Lynn, and his heirs and assigns, All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina and County of Greenville in O'Neal Township on the Rutherford Road, and having the following meter and bounds according to a plat made by W. D. Adams, Surveyor, to-wit: Beginning at an iron pin in the Rutherford road, and running thence S. 8 1/2 W. 9.24 to iron pin in Barton's line; thence along said line S. 5 1/4 W. 4.70 to iron pin; thence S. 45 1/2 E. 6.00 to iron pin in Rutherford road; thence along said road as the line S. 6 3/4 W. 9.69 to a bend in said road; thence still along said road as the line S. 39 3/4 E. 9.65 to an iron pin near the fork of the Rutherford road and a settlement road; thence N. 30 3/4 E. 2.36 along said settlement road to a bend; thence still along said road N. 62 3/4 E. 1.75 to bend in said road; thence still along said road N. 88 E. 4.15 to an iron pin in thence N. 12 W. 4.12 to a spring; thence N. 11 1/2 E. 6.85 to a stone; thence S. 75 1/2 E. 1.05 to a stone; thence N. 27 3/4 E. 4.05 to iron pin; on branch (the Spring branch being approximately the line from the Spring to the iron pin corner); thence leaving said branch and running thence N. 58 3/8 W. 13.28 to the beginning corner, and containing 27 1/2 acres, more or less, this being a portion of the land conveyed to me by J. D. Gilbreath et al, by deed, dated 29th day of December 1917, and State in Vol. #51 of Deeds, at page 56.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned, unto the said W. F. Lynn, and his heirs and assigns, forever.

AND myself and my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said W. F. Lynn, and his heirs and assigns, against myself and my heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
