Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars,
to me paid by the said R. F. Lenhardt

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release
unto the said R. F. Lenhardt

All that piece, parcel and tract of land
situate on the north side of the Saluda
River, in Paris Mountain Township, County and
State aforesaid, and being a portion of tract
No. 4 of a sub-division of the Rutledge Saluda
River Plantation, containing eighty-nine and
five-tenths acres, more or less, and more
particularly described as follows: Beginning
at a post oak, gone, on stone in old road;
thence S. 36 1/2 W. 26.04 to a spring, thence S.
64 1/4 W. 24.12, more or less, to a point in the
water intersecting the line of the fifteen
acre conveyed to A. H. Furrman by Mattie
J. Earle; thence along that line following
the meanderings of Saluda River to the
mouth of a branch; thence up the
meanderings of said branch to a small
spruce; thence N. 61 E. 8.90 to a small
