the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Lewis M. Bullough and Sallie M. Bullough

the following described real estate to-wit:
All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Grove Township Greenville County, State of South Carolina near the town of Piedmont, being one half acre, more or less, devised to William Shired and Fletcher Shired by their father, Henry Shired, and recorded in Hill Book A in the office of the Judge of Probate for said County, at page 444, said lots conveyed by lands of J. D. Nesbitt, by William Marshall, and Piedmont Manufacturing Company, being the same lot conveyed to Adam B. Helbohn and Wyley Seagriff by J. D. Nesbitt, March 21, 1912 and recorded in C. R. M.
