WHEREAS, Lawrence O. Patterson

our Lord nineteen hundred and ten exhibited his complaint in the Court of
Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against George E. Wilson

demanding judgment in relation to the real estate hereinafter
mentioned and described; and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 17th
day of April 1910, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree

of the said Court

Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Eleven Hundred
to me paid by the said L. O. Patterson

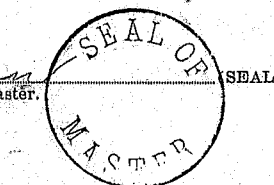
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release
unto the said L. O. Patterson

estate, to wit: All that lot or parcel of land situate
on Paris Mountain, in the County of Greenville and
State of South Carolina, being lot numbered twenty-
three (23) of Section "A" of the land of the Paris Mountain
Land Company, said being the same conveyed to
George E. Wilson by Jas. W. McCullough on January
24th 1905; also all those certain lots of land situate
in the County and State aforesaid, on Paris
Mountain being the same conveyed to said
George E. Wilson by said Paris Mountain Land
Company by three several deeds, dated respectively
March 27th 1906, April 12th 1906, and May 14th
1906, said lots or parcels of land being described
in said deeds as follows to wit: (1) Lot numbered
twenty-two (22) twenty-four (24) and twenty-five (25)
of Section "A" in plat of lands of said Company,
recorded in R. M. C. office for said County in
Deed Book D. D. D., page 982; (2) also lot numbered
twenty-four (24) of Section "A" on said Plat; (3) also
that tract on Paris Mountain having the following
courses and distances to wit: beginning at a
stone on H. C. Markle's corner and running
thence N. 46 E. 18.00 chains to a pine stump; thence
N. 16 W. 18.00 chains to a stone; thence N. 56 W. 5.00
