KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, THAT

Brandon Mills

a corporation chartered under the laws of the State of South Carolina, and having its principal place of business at Greenville, in the State of South Carolina, for and in consideration of the sum of \$500 Dollars and other valuable Considerations DOLLARS, to it in hand duly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents by the grantee... hereinafter named, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto

W. F. Davis, R. H. Huff, W. R. Young, Joseph Mutual, F. W. Stewart, J. W. Hill and W. T. Hill, Deacons of the Baptist Church at Brandon Mills.

All that certain lot or parcel of land situated in the County and State aforesaid, near the city of Greenville and being a portion of the Brandon Mills property and of having the following lines, courses and distances to-wit:

Beginning at any iron pin in the corner of Green and Pettet Streets thence with Pettet Street N. 16° 34' E. 257 feet to stake next Pettet Street, thence S. 85° 58' W. 177.6 feet to stake on line of Green Street, thence with Green Street S. 24° 22' 56" feet to the beginning corner, containing forty-eight one hundredths (.48) of an acre more or less.

Nevertheless, upon the following uses and trusts: That is to say, to the need by the said grantee and their successors in the office of Deacons of said Baptist Church for the uses and purposes of said church and subject to the control of said church in perpetuity.

Provided, however, that if the said lot should ever cease to be used for church purposes, then and in such case the title herein conveyed shall escheat and the said lot of land shall revert to the grantor.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the premises before mentioned unto the grantee... hereinabove named, and his successors heirs and assigns forever.

a corporation chartered under the laws of the State of South Carolina, and having its principal place of business at Greenville, in the State of South Carolina, for and in consideration of the sum of One Thousand Fifty Dollars DOLLARS, to it in hand duly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents by the grantee... hereinafter named, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto Jessie P. Woodside

All those certain four(4) pieces, parcels or lots of land situate lying and being in the State and County aforesaid, near the Eastern limits of the City of Greenville, in section known as "Overbrook" and being designated as lots nos. 66, 65, 67 and 63, as shown by plat made by H. Olin Jones, Architect and Engineer Sept. 17th 1913 and additions made March 3rd 1915 said plat being recorded in office of R.M.C. for Greenville County in plat book "C" page 224, where further reference may be made.

Upon condition however, which is a part of the consideration of this deed that the grantee, his heirs and assigns, shall not sell, or otherwise dispose of said property to any person or persons of African descent and shall erect no buildings thereon costing less than \$2000.00, nor within 30 feet from line of sidewalk, except in cases of lots nos. 63 and 66, as to sidewalk restriction.
