did on the 10th day of May 1919, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: The names and residences of the said petitioner to be as above given.

SECOND: The name of the proposed corporation be that of

The Marietta Mercantile Company

THIRD: The principal place of business of the corporation will be

Marietta, S.C.

FOURTH: The general purpose of the corporation, and the nature of business it proposes to do.

In a general mercantile business, to buy and sell and deal in groceries, produce, dry goods, notions, shoes, clothing, hats, and other goods and merchandises, wholesale and retail, and to exercise all powers incident to a corporation of this nature, including the right to mortgage both real and personal property.

FIFTH: The amount of the capital stock to be Five thousand Dollars, and the number of shares into which the same is to be divided to be Fifty
