KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That We, J. B. Earle and B. T. Earle as Executors under the will of Thos. Earle deceased

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand DOLLARS, to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Piedmont Bonded Warehouse and Compuss Company

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, sell and Release unto the said

Piedmont Bonded Warehouse and Compuss Company All that certain piece parcel or lot of land situate lying and being in the State and County aforesaid near the corporate limits of the City of Greenville S. C. and having the following metes and bounds as appears on a plat of said property made by R. E. Dalton in June 1919 and which said plat is to be recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County Beginning at a point in the center of Reddy River and in the center of Washington Road, where the road crosses the River; and running thence with the center of said Road in a Northwesterly direction 79 or 2 feet to a point in the center of said Road 12 1/2 feet east of the center line of the Southern Railway siding thence by a North Easterly direction 12 1/2 feet east of said siding and parallel therewith 536.7 feet to a point between the said siding and the S. & W. Railway; thence in a South Easterly direction 56.4 feet to the center of the River; thence down the meanders of said River, the courses and distances being fully set forth on the plat, to the beginning corner, the center of the River being at all points the property line. All reversionary interest in said property is hereby conveyed to the grantee herein, its successors and assigns.
