KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That Me, J. Walter Gray and Laurence M. Gray of the City and County of Greenville

in the State aforesaid,
 in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars and other Valuable Considerations DOLLARS
 to us in hand paid
 at and before the sealing of these presents by Harry N. Gray of the same City, County and State

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, sell and Release unto the said

Harry N. Gray his heirs and assigns forever: All our right, title, interest and estate of, in and to all those pieces, parcels and tracts of land hereinafter described to wit: All that piece, parcel or lot of land lying and being and situate in the County and State aforesaid, and about two miles west of Greenville Court House, between Brandon and Woodside Cotton Mills, and known as lot no. 10 on the plat of "Donwood" property, recorded in office of R. M. C. in plat book "A" page 462 and 463, said lot has a frontage on Woodside Avenue of fifty feet, and a depth of one hundred and fifty feet being the same lot of land conveyed to W. E. Holbrook by deed bearing date January 15th 1912, and recorded in Vol. 17 page 219 and by him to H. A. W. Gilbert by deed bearing date June 16th 1913, recorded in Vol. 18 page 434, and by H. A. W. Gilbert to J. W. Gray by deed bearing date December 4th 1913 and recorded in R. M. C. Office Greenville County in Deed Book Vol. 23, page 454.

Also all that other lot or parcel of land situate in the City and County of Greenville State aforesaid on Echols Street beginning at an iron pin on said street and running thence S. 57 W. 104 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 35 W. 145 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 57 E. 102 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 35 1/2 E. 159 feet to an iron pin; the beginning corner known as lot no. 1 on plat no. 2 made by J. W. Curston, Oct. 13 1903, to which plat reference is made as often as may be necessary. Being the same lot conveyed to J. W. Gray by D. O. Verder Master by deed bearing date January 25, 1914 and recorded in R. M. C. Office Greenville County in Vol. 23, page 44. This land was devised to us by the last will and testament of J. W. Gray, dec.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned, unto the said Harry N. Gray, his heirs and assigns, forever.

AND we do hereby bind ourselves and our heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said Harry N. Gray, his

heirs and assigns, against us and ours heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
