unto the said.

E. E. Watson, his heirs and assigns forever, the following described real-estate, to-wit:
"All that piece, parcel or tract of land situated in Greenville Township, Greenville
County, State of South Carolina, in the City of Greenville, in the first Ward, on Bulls
Alley, being the western portion of the lot conveyed to Samuel Deen by Jas. L. Orr,
October 4th, 1897, recorded in the Office of Register Mesne Conveyance for Greenville,
in Book 600, page 154, and bounded as follows:
Beginning at a stake on said alley, midway of the front of the lot conveyed by said
Orr, and running in a northerly direction about eighty-two feet nine inches to a stake
midway of the back line of said lot conveyed by said Orr; thence N. 83 W. forty-one feet
