

The State of South Carolina
By The Secretary of State.

Whereas, Fifty freeholders voters of the proposed town of West Greenville, S. C. did on the eight day of October 1914. file with the Secretary of State a written petition, signed by themselves, setting forth:

First: That they were citizens and free holders and and electors of the proposed town.

Second: The name of the proposed town to be West Greenville, S. C.

Third: The corporate limits of the town to be: Begin at the S. E. corner of J. M. Keyway, Jus. Pearman, said Woodside Mill property, and run thence with said Pearson and Woodside Mill property line N. 78-30 E. 518' to an I. P. thence N. 53-30, W. 187 1/2' to an I. P. just across a small branch & road J. M. Honour Ave. thence S. 40-15, W. 191' to center of Piedmont & Northern right of way; thence southward with center of said line of right of way 2249 ft. to an I. P. in center of said right of way and under center of Southern R. R. overhead crossing; thence easterly with center of said Southern R. R. track 405 ft. to an I. P. in center of tracks and center Earle's Bridge Road; thence with center of Earle's Road (or Pendleton Street extension) 894' to an I. P. in center of Greenville Traction Co. tracks; thence with center of said Greenville Traction Co. tracks across Mason St. by Duncan Spur switch, across Dunham Bridge Road 3180' to an I. P. on City limits of Greenville, S. C. and 55' S 17-50 E. from a C. L. stone set by city of Greenville, S. C. on north west side of Dunham Bridge Road; thence with City limit line as laid out & marked by the City of Greenville, S. C. in a northerly direction, across Pendleton Street, Perry Avenue, Queen Street & Birnie Street 2713' to the center of Southern R. R.; thence R. R. track S. 58-45, W. 63' to an I. P. in center of Birnie Street crossing this point being 34' from post 488 of Southern R. R.; thence with said St. N. 69-30, W. 780' to an I. P. in angle; thence N. 72-10, W. 749' to an I. P. in center of East fifth Street and on line of Woodside Mill property; thence with east side of a street S. 16 W. 324' to an I. P. 37' of Mill property; thence S. 74 E. 171' to an I. P. in center of Vause Street

thence with center of Vause Street S. 11-45 W. 570' to an I. P. in center of East Main Street; thence with center of East Main Street N. 78-30, W. 189' to center of siding to Woodside Mill; thence with center of said siding toward Southern Main line 967 to center of Main line opposite switch post; thence with center of main line S. 58-45 W. 523' to center of Woodside Avenue; thence with center of Woodside Avenue northward 757' to I. P. in center of said Avenue & on line of Woodside Mill property; thence with said line N. 68-20, W. 429' to the beginning.

Fourth: That they desire to be incorporated. And, Whereas, on the thirteenth day of November, 1914, the said Prof. E. L. Hughes, J. M. Honour and J. M. Phillips who were commissioned by me did file with the Secretary of State their return in writing, over their signatures, certifying the result of said elections with the Managers' return attached, in favor of corporation, the name of the town, and that J. M. Phillips was elected Mayor, and J. M. Godfrey, E. L. Hughes, D. C. Alberson, R. H. Huff, J. M. Camp and J. M. Honour were elected Wardens.

Now, Therefore, I, R. M. Mc. Cown, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by an Act of the General Assembly, entitled "An Act to provide for the Incorporation of Towns of not less than one Thousand, nor more than Five Thousand, "Inhabitants," approved the fifth day of March A. D. 1896. do hereby issue to the Mayor and Alderman elect this Certificate of Incorporation of the Town of West Greenville, S. C. with the powers, privileges and immunities, and subject to the limitations prescribed in the said act.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the State this the thirteenth day of November in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Nine hundred and Fourteen and in the 139th year of the Independence of the United States of America.
