

\$25.00 Received of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company of South Carolina twenty-five Dollars, in consideration of which, I., hereby grant unto said Company, its successors and assigns, the right, privilege and authority to construct, operate and maintain its lines of Telephone and Telegraph, including the necessary poles, wires and fixtures upon, over and across the property which I own, or in which I have any interest, in the -- of -- , County of Greenville and State of South Carolina, and upon and along the roads, streets, or highways adjoining the said property, with the rights to permit the attachment of the wires of any other company, and the right to trim any trees along said lines so as to keep the wires cleared at least eighteen inches, to erect and set the necessary guy and brace poles and anchors and to attach thereto and to trees the necessary guy wires; said sum being received in full payment therefor. This grant includes right to erect & maintain 7 guyes & anchors, poles 4017-40 Charlotte - Atlanta Line. The Company agreeing to pay her any damages to growing crops caused by maintenance of line.

"Article XI, Section I. - The President, any Vice President or the General Manager and Secretary, shall have power and authority to appoint resident Assistant Secretaries and Attorney-in-fact, and to authorize them to execute on behalf of the Company and attach the Seal of the Company thereto, bonds and undertakings, recognizances, contracts of indemnity and other writings obligatory in the nature thereof".
