Received of Postal Telegraph & Cable Company, Three hundred (\$300.00) dollars in full of all damages, and four and 95/100 (\$4.95) dollars Court costs, which is in full satisfaction and release of a claim for damage charged in an action against said Company, instituted by me on June 5, 1920, in the Court of Common Pleas for Greenville County. In consideration of said settlement, I do hereby grant to the said Postal Telegraph & Cable Company the right to maintain its thirty (30) poles now established on my land in said State and County, along and near the Augusta Road, being bounded on the north by lands of J. M. McDaniel and on the South by lands of W. M. Steuhouse, together with the right to maintain the necessary guyes and brace poles and to attach the necessary guy wires just as the same now exist and also it shall have the right of ingress and egress for the purpose of inspecting, repairing and replacing the lines of telegraph, and said thirty (30) poles in their present position; said right being hereby conferred to the said Company, its successors and assigns, and is to be binding upon me and my heirs and assigns, together with the right to keep the wires cleared at least eighteen (18) inches to all trees or other obstructions.
