WHEREAS, Julia Walker, Brooks W. Walker, Henry Walker, Mary Robinson and Bruce Walker

on or about the 23rd day of February in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and twenty-one exhibited their complaint in the Court of Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against James Walker

demanding relief as to the real estate described in the complaint: and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 26th day of March 1921, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. Inman

Master in and for the County aforesaid, to Henry Walker for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court, will appear; (See Judgment Roll No. )

NOW, Therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, that I, E. Inman, Master, in and for the County of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree, HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release unto the said

Henry Walker, his heirs and assigns forever, the following described real-estate, to-wit: "All that certain piece, parcel and tract of land situate, lying and being in Paris Mountain Township, in the County and State aforesaid, and containing Ten (10) acres, more or less, and having the following lines, metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at an iron pin on the White Horse Road, joint corner of tracts Nos. 4 and 5, and running thence S. 86.10 E. 25.00 to an iron pin nm; thence N. 8-1/2 W. 3.57 to stone om; thence N. 87-1/2 W. 13.80 to stone om; thence N. 2-1/2 E. 3.32 to a P.O.; stone gone, thence N. 87-1/2 W. 8.80 to an iron pin at the White Horse Road; thence along said White Horse Road 6.20 chains to iron pin at the beginning corner, and being known and designated as tract No. 4, in the partition of the lands of J.H. Walker, deceased, according to a subdivision and plat thereof made by W.A. Hester, Surveyor, dated March 15, 1921.

TOGETHER with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining; and all the estate, right, title, claim and interest whatsoever of the parties to the cause aforesaid, and of each of them in and to the same; and of all other persons rightfully claiming from, under, or any of them.
