our Lord nineteen hundred and eighteen exhibited his complaint in the Court  
of Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against Jno. H. Harrison Jr. & Howard  
H. Branyon

demanding relief as to the real estate described in the complaint: and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 27th  
day of January 1919, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree of the said Court, whereby it  
was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. Inman  
Master in and for the County aforesaid, to Jno. H. Harrison Jr.  
for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court, will appear; (See Judgment Roll No. 4)

NOW, Therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, that I, E. Inman  
Master, in and for the County of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree, and upon receipt of \$800.00  
HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release unto the said

Jno. H. Harrison Jr. all the right, title and  
interest the said interest being an  
undivided 1/2 therein of R. L. Branyon and  
Howard H. Branyon also heirs of Hillie  
Branyon deceased in and to all that  
certain piece parcel or tract of land  
lying being and situate in the county  
and state aforesaid, the same being  
a part of a tract of land conveyed to  
me by the said Samuel E. Harrison  
and Richard Harrison on the 15th  
day of November, 1894 by the deed of  
D. P. Turner, Master of Greenville County  
and recorded in the office of R. M. C.  
for said county in vol. B. B. B. page 594  
the same being the homestead tract  
of Jno. H. Harrison Sr. and containing  
one hundred acres more or less, and  
more fully described as follows:  
Beginning on stone near the middle  
of Jenkins Bridge Road, and thence  
N. 33 1/2 W. 34.80 to large P. C. 3 x 6 m; thence  
N. 60 1/2 W. 6.45 to stone 3x; thence S. 46 W.  
31.51 to stone on Richard Harrison's line  
S. 60 1/2 E. 46.80 to stone on Jenkins Bridge  
Road; thence N. 54 3/4 E. 12.36 to stone on road;  
thence N. 37 E. 3.72 to beginning corner  
bounded by lands of D. P. Coy, Samuel  
and Richard Harrison and James  
Henderson.

appertaining; and all the estate, right, title, claim and interest whatsoever of the parties to the cause aforesaid, and of each of them in and to the same;

Jno. H. Harrison Jr. his heirs and assigns forever.
