KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, George Grandchamp, of the County of Greenville
South Carolina, in consideration of the sum of Ten DOLLARS,
and other valuable considerations
to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by C.P. Sorbet, of the City of Greenville, South Carolina

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said C.P. Sorbet, All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, in the County of Greenville and Township of Greenville, and being a short distance outside the corporate limits of the City of Greenville, and being known and designated as Lot Number Seven on the map or Plan of "Sans Souci Villa", which is of record in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyances for Greenville County, and on the map or Plan of the George Grandchamp property recorded in said Register of Mesne Conveyances' office in plan book E., at page 225, reference to said plats being made as a part of this description; said piece, parcel or lot of land being described by metes and bounds as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point on the South line of Young Street two hundred twenty-five feet west (or northwest) from the intersection of the west line of Brockman Avenue with the said South line of Young Street, and running thence along the said South line of Young Street North 57 degrees 25 min. West seventy-eight feet to a point; thence in a Southwesterly direction at right angles to said South line of Young Street two hundred feet to a point; thence in a Southeasterly direction, along a line parallel with said South line of Young Street, one hundred sixty-two feet to a point; thence North 10 degrees 30 min. East two hundred seventeen feet to the South line of Young Street, the point of beginning. This being a part of that certain tract of land heretofore conveyed to George Grandchamp by deed of Suburban Land Company dated the day of April A.D. 1920, and recorded in said R.M.C. Office in Deed Book 29, at page 439, reference to which is hereby made.

TOGETHER with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.
TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned, unto the said C.P. Sorbet and his heirs and assigns, forever.

AND I do hereby bind myself and my heirs, executors, and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said C.P. Sorbet and his heirs and assigns, against myself and my every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
