which has been duly and regularly organized, did on the 20th day of January, A. D. 1933, file with the Secretary of State a written declaration setting forth:

That at a meeting of the aforesaid organization held pursuant to the by-laws or regulations of the said organization, they were authorized and directed to apply for incorporation.

That the said organization holds, or desires to hold, property in common for a Religious, Educational, Social, Fraternal, Charitable or other eleemosynary purpose, or any two or more of said purposes, and is not organized for the purpose of profit or gain to the members, otherwise than is above stated, or for the insurance of life, health, accident or property; and that three days' notice in the Greenville News, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville, has been given that the aforesaid Declaration would be filed.

AND WHEREAS, That said Declarants and Petitioners further declared and affirmed: FIRST. Their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND. The name of the proposed Corporation is The Southern Textile Athletic Association.

THIRD. The place at which it proposes to have its headquarters or be located is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH. The purpose of the said proposed Corporation is

To promote the social and physical life of textile boys and girls in the Southern States. To promote a more desirable relationship between the villages of the textile mills throughout the South. This organization does not operate for any profit, neither does it make any.

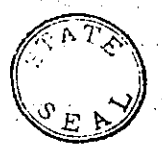
FIFTH. The names and residences of all Managers, Trustees, Directors or other officers are as follows:
