WHEREAS, John I. Rose, Perry Woods, W.K. Livingstone, T.F. McDow and A.H. Montiath all of Greenville, S.C.

did on the fourth day of August, 1921, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is The Greenville Wholesale Credit Bureau

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to collect and furnish to the stockholders information in relation to the financial and credit standing of retail merchants in the vicinity, to assist the stockholders in the collection of accounts and in the handling of all matters which the stockholders may desire it to handle, to encourage closer relation between the stockholders, and to do all other acts and things of a similar nature not forbidden by law.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Two thousand five hundred (\$2,500.00) Dollars, payable as called for by the Directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is fifty (50) of the par value of fifty (\$50.00) Dollars each

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the second day of August, 1921, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: W.K. Livingstone, J.I. Rose, T.F. McDow, A.H. Montiath and Perry Woods.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Perry Woods; as Vice-President W.K. Livingstone; as Treasurer J.P. Abernethy; as Secretary J.P. Abernethy;

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XLVII, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1912, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Daily News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. Banks Dove, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

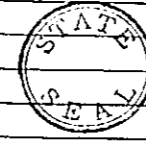
FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
