EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT. WHEREAS, B. J. Bright of Greer, S. C., and J. Wilson of Wellford S. C.

did on the 19th day of October, 1921, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Bright-Wilson Co. Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greer S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is To buy and sell wholesale and retail Hardware, Supplements, Vehicles and any other kind of products or merchandise, without limitation as to class, to lease, and buy real estate, for the conduct of its business and generally to make contracts and borrow money incidental to its business, and to do all things necessary to the proper and legal conduct of a general mercantile business.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. Banks Dove, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Means Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One Thousand Dollars, payable in cash or property as called for by the Directors.

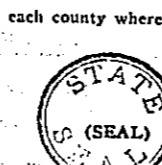
