EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT. WHEREAS, P. B. Morgan, Central, S. C. and M. V. Miller, Greenville, S. C.

did on the 31st day of May, 1922, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given. SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is United Parfay Company. THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, South Carolina. FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is
