WHEREAS, W. K. Hudgens of Pelzer, S. C. and F. E. Schroder and G. G. Hunter, both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 31st day of January, 1924, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
