formerly belonging to Newton Sullivan, Mrs. Kate
Burke, Ben Barnes, Henry Baker and the estate of
J. P. Nabors, deceased, being a part of the Old Newton
Sullivan place, and having certain bounds and
distances as shown on plat of said land made by
J. P. Willis surveyor.

TOGETHER with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or
appertaining.
