(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said

A.Y. Willis: All those two certain pieces, parcels or lots of land in the County and State aforesaid, near the City of Greenville, in the subdivision known as "Kamateneh", and known as lots #12 and #13 in Block "F", on revised plat of the said property to be recorded in R.M.C. Office for said County. The said lots have the following metes and bounds: Beginning at a stake on the North side of Cureton Street at corner of Lot #11 and running thence along said Street 120 feet, more or less to stake at corner of lot #14; thence along said lot 155 feet to stake at corner of lot #27; thence along #27 and #26, 120 feet to stake at corner of lot #11; thence along said lot, 160 feet to the beginning point on said Cureton Street.

For value received, Southeastern Life Insurance Company does hereby release and forever relinquish unto the within named A.Y. Willis and his heirs and assigns, all the land herein described from the lien of two mortgages executed by F.A.
