All that certain lot or parcel of land situate, lying and being in Greenville Township, County and State aforesaid, near the City of Greenville, known and designated as lot No. 86 of the subdivision known as Augusta Circle as shown on a plat of record in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in the Plat Book "F," page 23, and having according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin on the western side of Tomassess Avenue, the joint corner of lots Nos. 86 and 77 and running thence with the joint line of said lots 71-35 W. 150 feet to an iron pin, the joint corner of lots 76, 77, 96, and 97, thence with the joint line of lots #36 and 97 S. 21-35 W. 50 feet to an iron pin the joint corner of lots Nos. 85, 86, 97 and 98; thence with the joint line of lots Nos. 85 and 86 S. 71-35 E. 150 feet to an iron pin on the western side of Tomassess Ave., the joint corner of lots Nos. 85 and 86, thence with the western side of Tomassess Ave., N. 21-35 E. to the point of beginning.

- (3) The property herein conveyed shall never be sold, rented or otherwise disposed of to negroes or persons having any percentage of negro blood.
