Conveyances for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Book 117, at page 1, to which instrument and the record thereof reference is hereby made for its terms, stipulations and conditions. .

Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining.

To have and to hold all and singular the aforesaid lands and premises, rights and privileges, unto the said party of the second part, his heirs, executors and assigns forever.

The party of the first part does not warrant the title to the lands and premises here'y conveyed except as against its own acts.
