D. Hall and W. D. Merritt

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in Greenville Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, near the Augusta Road School site, on Tennessee Avenue

and being known and designated as lot No. 15 of the C. B. MARTIN sub-division, as shown on a plat of record in Plat Book "F," page 102, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin on the corner of Tennessee Avenue and a twenty-foot road and running thence N. 71-35 W. 218.5 feet to an iron pin on said road; thence S. 41-10 E. 245.4 feet to an iron pin on Tennessee Avenue, joint corner of lots #14 and 15; thence N. 21-35 E. 124.6 feet to an iron pin, the point of beginning.

- (1) No building shall be erected nearer to the abutting sidewalk than thirty feet.
(2) The property herein conveyed shall never be sold, rented, or otherwise disposed of to a person, or persons, having any percentage of Negro blood.
(3) The property herein conveyed shall never be used for other than residential purposes, and no residence costing less than four thousand dollars shall ever be erected thereon.

And the said granting corporation does hereby bind itself and its successors to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the grantee hereinabove named, and their

heirs and assigns, against itself and its successors, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
