 Natalie P. Cleveland and Daisy B. Cleveland, jointly and severally, all that tract or parcel of land situate, lying  
 and being more particularly described in the City of Greenville, County of  
 Greenville, State of South Carolina, on the West side  
 of South Main Street between Main Avenue and  
 Court Street, and having more particularly described  
 as follows to wit: a tract of land bounded by; G. M. Furman,  
 on the north side, and the same book 1825, as follows:  
 South Main Street at the angle of the west side of  
 brick at front of property of G. M. Furman, extending  
 along the south side of Main Avenue, and running  
 back 10' from the front of the northern edge of said  
 tract of land, to the rear edge of said brick  
 wall, 10' from the rear edge of said brick  
 wall, 10' from the rear edge of said brick wall at the south

 heirs and assigns, forever.


